



CITY OF GROVEPORT REPORT TO MAYOR AND COUNCIL

Engineering Department – *Steve Farst*

- **Capital Projects:**

West Bixby Road

Construction is underway. The path is being paved and roadside drainage is being installed. The contractor implemented the detour routes on July 6, and shoulder drainage improvement was started. Weather permitting, pavement-base reclamation is anticipated to occur on or near 7/14 to 7/17. Paving will then proceed immediately after. Again weather permitting, it is anticipated that roadway will be re-opened to thru traffic by August 1.

Hendron Road Reconst

Construction is underway. Sidewalks were installed from Glendening Dr. intersection north to and connecting with ex. walks on Cherry Blossom Dr. in late June. The north half roadway work is underway: excavation, subgrade stabilization, storm sewerage, underdrains, street lighting conduit and curb work is being installed. The new 12-inch water main was completed and put into service the week of June 20. It is anticipated that the north-half closure will end and road reopened, weather permitting by August 14, when phase two for the southern half is to begin.

- **Streets/Street:**

Columbus Asphalt Paving, Inc. was awarded contract in May. Preconstruction meeting held June 8. Work expected to begin at end of July. Please refer to last month's report for listing of improvement areas.

During work times, some street-side parking will be temporarily discontinued. Resident notices will be posted in work areas in advance of the work to be performed.

- **Development projects:**

New High School site

Site improvements are preceding. Consulting Engineer for the School is designed pedestrian improvements at the SR 317/high school main entrance. Review underway.

- **Other:**

CMOM program

As part of our "Capacity, Management, Operation and Maintenance" program for our sanitary collection system, information on appropriate disposal of fats, oil and grease will be delivered in mid-July to residential properties in Newport, Westport, The Orchard and Hendron Rd corridor. Notices such as this help to educate the public that properly disposed waste of this type reduces cost on private sanitary sewer laterals and the public system.
