- Emergency Operations Plan

Council and Mayor will be given a copy of the Emergency Operations Plan at the committee meeting. The Chief and I will briefly discuss the plan, and provide Council some time to review the plan. Please remember that this is a living

document which will continue to be revised as needed. Included with the plan that is kept at each facility will be the City's equipment and vehicle inventory.

- Bixby Road OPWC Application and Five Year Plan
There will be two pieces of legislation introduced at the next Council meeting. The first is a resolution approving an update of our Five Year Plan. This year is just an update, with 2014 being a full-blown project review. The second is an ordinance authorizing the submittal of an application for the West Bixby Road Pavement Rehabilitation (Phase 1) project. This is a smaller application than the two we submitted and received in 2012. Next year will be a much larger application for the Hendron Road reconstruction project to be submitted in conjunction with the Safe Routes sidewalk application. We will be requesting that the legislation be adopted and effective prior to OPWC's deadline of Sept. 16. We will need them approved no later than the Sept. 9 meeting. We will also be scheduling a public meeting for this project.

- Legislation Requests
Ord. 13-034 On behalf of the Apple Butter Day committee, I am requesting legislation that would prohibit garage sales from occurring the day of any Groveport sponsored festival. We have had issues with neighbors of the festival area selling wares from their residence and calling it a "garage sale". This is in direct competition to the vendors that pay to be part of the festival. The other issue is the increased traffic that a garage sale brings and traffic is usually congested during our festivals as it is. Thanks for your consideration.

Ord. 13-036 Requested information regarding the purchase of a dump truck for the Public Works Department will be provided by Dennis Moore at the meeting. (Please note that neither Dennis nor I expected the ordinance to be approved at the last Council meeting since we knew additional information had been requested and we were both on vacation last meeting.)

- Issues regarding "Tin Man" Water Tank
Stephen Moore and I will provide Council with information as to what transpired regarding the water tank and neighboring property owner's concerns. This discussion is too lengthy for a written report.

- Sidewalk Program and Issues
 1. Replacing defective sidewalks. The process currently followed is to continue to replace defective public sidewalk sections. This followed a sidewalk project in which Groveport paid the entire cost of repair and replacing public sidewalks. (See below.)

- Ord. 94-97 established a sidewalk repair and reconstruction program – this addressed replacing and repairing existing sidewalks, with 50% being paid by the Village and 50% paid by the property owner by assessment.
- Res. 15-99 authorized the Village Administrator to advertise for bids for the sidewalk improvement program. This project replaced a large number of defective sidewalks and driveway approaches.
- Ord. 51-99 modified 94-97 by allowing the Village to pay the entire replacement cost on a one-time basis.
- Ord. 63-99 accepted a bid of \$291,130.60 for the sidewalk improvements.

Since that project, Groveport has routinely repaired and replaced sidewalks using a list of sidewalks that have been reported to be defective.

2. Installing sidewalks where there are currently none. Regarding gaps in sidewalk areas or no sidewalks, the policy has been to include sidewalk installation when streets are reconstructed, depending on available right of way and design.
3. Safe Routes to School Program. The possibility of extending sidewalks to the high school was brought up at the last Council meeting. The Safe Routes to School program is only eligible for pedestrian access to middle and elementary schools. We will be submitting a project application for Hendron Road at the program's next funding round in January, 2014.
4. Wirt Road. At an earlier meeting this year, I discussed the possibility of extending a multi-use path along Wirt Road using the canal bed that the City owns. There are a few missing teeth in this path, one being canal property still owned by the State of Ohio and leased by Groveport. No one seems to know why this wasn't turned over to Groveport with the rest of the canal parcels. In mid-July I requested that ODNR turn over this parcel; the representative I talked with indicated this should not be a problem. I believe that this leaves just one parcel that is needed, but I am currently verifying this.
5. Cypress Grove Condominium Association. The condition of the sidewalks within the condominium community was brought up at the last Council meeting. Since these are public sidewalks we will inspect them to determine which if any, need repaired or replaced.
6. Sidewalks in Founders Bend subdivision in need of repair. Resident to provide a list.

7. Replacing defective sidewalks is discussed in Section 729 of the Ohio Revised Code. The code indicates the property owner's responsibility and the assessment procedure if the municipality performs the corrections. Since Groveport has accepted this burden from the property owner, one thing we should do better is to make sure that the property owners within Groveport are aware of this service being extended to them.
- Groveport Charter School Access Issue
I've researched the issue of a traffic signal or left turn lane at SR317 and Ventura Place. Groveport Charter School was granted a Use Variance in 2008 to operate the school at 4085 Ventura Place. Included in the legislation approving the variance were three conditions: 1) the applicant was to perform a traffic study within 90 days of the approval; 2) the findings of the traffic study were to be reviewed and approved by the Village; and 3) the applicant was to implement all Village approved recommendations of the traffic study provided that, a) if a traffic signal was recommended, the applicant was required to participate on an equitable cost-sharing basis for the signal design and installation with all other private and public entities benefitting from the new signal, and/or b) if construction of a connecting roadway through and from the applicant's property was recommended, the applicant would be responsible for the connection to the nearest agreed upon access point to the applicant's property.

The traffic study was performed by the applicant's engineer, and reviewed by EMH&T and then ODOT in 2009. The final report by ODOT indicated that a traffic signal was not warranted, and their recommendation was to a) make geometric improvements to the left turn lanes at SR317 and Ventura Place intersection without installing the traffic signal, b) work with the school for them to fund a portion of the traffic signal design and construction when the need for the signal was greater, and c) work with the school and high school to construct an access road through the high school to access SR317 at the existing signal. I can find no information of anything further being done regarding this intersection. Should another traffic study be performed, it should be noted that a) there will be some cost sharing required of the charter school and b) ODOT will still need to provide their approval.

Your child's safety is our first and foremost concern but they must follow safety rules.

Being Safe on Your
Way to School

→ Metro Parks System

If you are using the metro Parks System, you are reminded that others use these trails for biking, walking and exercise.

RESPECT other rights to be there!

Be cautious and always wear your helmet. If you are passing a person, pass on the left and announce that you are doing so. An audible signal like a bell works great!

Riding and walking on the trails is similar to driving a car on the street. Stay to the right, don't walk across the paths and never block the paths.

Do not walk onto other properties—this is trespassing.

Obey the signage.

→ Walking on the Roadways

Always walk facing traffic. Wear reflective clothing. Never wear dark clothing at night or early mornings as drivers cannot see you. We suggest you carry a flashlight.

NEVER cross the street where there is heavy traffic, always use the crosswalks! Walk in pairs whenever possible.

If you walk on roadways **REMAIN** on the shoulder (berm) of the road, as far as practicable.

→ Driving

Remember there are changes in the laws about younger drivers:

- Under 17 years of age only one person who is not a family member is allowed in the car unless a parent or legal guardian is also in the car.
- No driving is allowed between midnight and 6 a.m., unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- If 17 or 18 years of age, hours of driving are restricted between 1 a.m. and 5 a.m., and to and from work, as long as there is written documentation from the employer.

→ Texting and Driving

Under the age of 18, it is illegal to use any mobile communications device while driving:

This means **NO** cell phone usage, **NO** emailing, **NO** texting, and **NO** iPad—this includes while being stationary at a traffic light.

This is considered a primary offense—one that is no different from speeding and an officer may pull you over.

Fines are up to \$150.00 along with a 60-day suspension of your license.

Juvenile Courts see this as a serious offense since your life and the lives of others are at stake.

Swim Lessons

The Groveport Parks and Recreation Department is a local provider of The American Red Cross Learn-to-Swim program. This program teaches participants, beginning at age five, how to swim skillfully and safely. Courses are fun and interactive. More advanced-level students refine their skills, learn the basics of springboard diving and how to incorporate swimming into a fitness plan. Below is a more detailed description of each level we have to offer.

Parent & Tot (6 months to 2 year of age):

This class is designed to give children an introduction into the world of pool water. Hands-on parent involvement required. You and your child will gain confidence in the water and learn water safety skills.

Pre-school Program (3 years to 5 years of age):

Splash, play games and build confidence. Class is designed for children that are unsure of the water.

LEVEL 1 - Introduction to Water Skills:

Helps students feel comfortable in water. Participants learn to enter & exit water safely, open eyes underwater & pick up submerged object, swim on front & back using arm & leg actions, submerge mouth, nose & eyes, float on front & back, follow basic rules, exhale underwater through mouth & nose, explore arm & leg movements, use a life jacket.

LEVEL 2 - Fundamentals of Aquatic Skills:

Participants learn to enter water by stepping or jumping from side, open eyes underwater, pick up a submerged object, roll over from front to back & back to front, swim on side, exit water safely using ladder or side, float on front & back, tread water using arm & leg motions, move in the water while wearing a life jacket, submerge entire head, perform front & back glide, swim on front & back using combined strokes.

LEVEL 3 - Stroke Development:

Participants learn to jump into deep water from the side, bob with head fully submerged, perform survival float, butterfly (kick & body motion), user check-call-care in an emergency, dive from kneeling or standing position, use rotary breathing in horizontal position, change from horizontal to vertical position on front & back, perform the HELP & Huddle position, submerge & retrieve an object, perform front & back glide & crawl, perform a reaching assist.

LEVEL 4 - Stroke Improvement:

Participants learn to dive or dive from stride position, perform open turns on front & back using any stroke, swim underwater, tread water using sculling arm motions & kick & perform feet first dive. Swimmers will perform front & back crawl, swim on side using scissors-like kick, breaststroke, butterfly & elementary backstroke.

LEVEL 5 - Stroke Refinement:

Participants learn to tread water with two different kicks, learn survival swimming & perform rescue breathing. Swimmers will perform standing dive, pike surface dive, butterfly, shallow dive, front flip turn, breaststroke, backstroke flip turn, elementary backstroke, tuck surface dive, front & back crawl, sidestroke.

LEVEL 6 - Swimming & Skill Proficiency:

Participants will refine their strokes so they swim with ease, efficiency, power and smoothness over greater distances. This class prepares swimmers to participate in more advanced courses, including Water Safety Instructor & Lifeguard Training Courses. These options include: personal water safety, fitness swimming, lifeguard readiness & fundamentals of diving.

Fall/Winter I Swim Lessons

Let our staff teach your child the skills they will use the rest of their life. Classes normally fill quickly.

Sports Medicine Minute

Don't Forget the Rehab

Sprains and strains are a common occurrence in athletic activities. And, they do not have to be the end of the season. The most important thing is to catch the injury early and address it with proper care immediately. Rehabilitation of an injury is the most effective means of reducing an athlete's time on the sideline. An athlete's return to play can be sped up by days, or even weeks, by dedication and compliance to a structured rehabilitation program.

"The length of a rehabilitation program is dependent upon the severity of the injury," explains Terri VanDeCarr, physical therapist for Nationwide Children's Sports medicine. "Mild sprains may only take a few days to a week to heal, while more severe injuries may require more intense therapy of several months."

In any event, the stages involved when rehabilitating an injury remains the same. The goals for each stage are as follows: Phase 1 Control Pain and Swelling, Phase 2 Improve Range of Motion and/or flexibility, Phase 3 Improve Strength & Begin Proprioception/Balance Training & Sport-Specific Training, and Phase 5 Gradual Return to Full Activity.

"The length of time an athlete spends in each of the various states of therapy is dependent upon several factors," says VanDeCarr. "Compliance and dedication to performing the prescribed exercises consistently at home, severity of injury, tolerance to pain, amount of swelling, or dysfunction, an level of conditioning prior to injury, are a few factors that can influence the length of rehabilitation."

What Does This Mean?

Sprains and strains are classified into three categories (discussed in greater detail in the August 2002 SportsPage article "The Sprains and Strains of Sporting Injuries"). As expected, the more severe the injury, the greater length of time needed to fully recover from that injury and return to full competition. First degree (mild) sprains and strains generally heal within two weeks (at a maximum). The length of rehabilitation for second degree (moderate) injuries is generally between two and six weeks. Third degree injuries (i.e. knee ligament or severe ankle sprains) typically require the athlete to be out of his sport for six weeks or more and involved in a structured rehabilitation program.

Give Us Some Examples

Phase one of the rehabilitative process focuses on controlling pain and swelling (if present). The general rule of Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation is used. Other modalities, such as electrical stimulation or ultrasound, may also be used by licensed professionals (athletic trainers or physical therapists) to assist with this process. If necessary, physicians may choose to prescribe medication.

Phase two, concentrates on increasing range of motion of a joint or flexibility of a muscle. Athletes are given specific stretching exercises to do on their own or may be manually stretched out by a therapist. It is recommended that all stretches be held for 30 seconds and repeated at least 4 times each.

The goal of the third phase of rehabilitation is to increase strength. Isometrics (pushing against an immovable object) may be used first, followed by the use of elastic bands of varying resistances, free weights, cuff weights, or weight equipment, Phase four focuses on proprioception/balance and sport-specific training. Proprioception is defined as the body's ability to know its position in space at all times without looking. Simply put, it is balance. When an athlete injures herself, she damages her ability to balance. Sport-specific training implements exercise, skills, or drills that athletes perform during games or practices. At this point, the therapist carefully progresses the injured athlete from basic exercises to those requiring higher skill level as they heal and have the muscle control to tolerate them without risking further injury. This leads to phase five of the rehabilitation process which gradually returns the athlete to full activity, while placing them on a maintenance program to prevent the reoccurrence of injury. While sprains and strains may be painful, it will pass, especially if treatment is started early and followed intently.
