

FACILITIES, PARKS & PUBLIC WORKS REPORT TO COUNCIL

DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES – NOVEMBER 2022

- Brush removal program removed 15 truckloads of brush and disposed at recycling facility
- Christmas wreaths installed 65 wreaths on light poles
- Fleet preparations for winter operations
- Founders Bend Park finalizing plans and permits for pavilion install and handicap access
- Heritage Park preparations for Heritage Holiday event
- Interviews for Grounds Maintenance Worker
- Leaf collection removed 250 cubic yards of leaves and disposed at recycling facility
- Meetings Public Service Director
 - o Central Ohio American Public Works Association meeting
 - Temporary Emergency Public Shelter kick-off meeting
 - Camera & door access solution meeting at Police Department
 - o Met with current HVAC maintenance contractor to acquire 2023 pricing
 - Currently comparing quotes from all vendors to select 2023 contractor
 - Fire & security contractor to acquire pricing for upgrade at three buildings

- Professional development Facilities, Parks, Public Works & Utilities staff attended an annual four-hour Snow & Ice Control Training
- Sanitary sewer operations
 - Cleaned and video inspected 1,350 feet of sewer line
 - o Located and inspected 12 manholes
- Snow & ice control Season total 1 event = \$1,199.32
 - November 2021
 - 1 snow event, totaling \$1,199.32
 - .25 inches of snow
 - 6 tons of road salt used, totaling \$371.52
 - 13 labor hours, totaling \$359.71
 - 9 truck & equipment hours, totaling \$468.09
- Street light repairs 6
- Street sweeping removed 20 cubic yards of debris
- Tree removal at 111 Church St coordinated with neighboring residents, removal of large tree
- Town Hall installed new electric circuit to enable lights to be hung for Heritage Holiday
- Veterans Park-
 - Preparations for Veteran's Day event
 - o Created database for inventory & locations of veteran bricks

- Water treatment and distribution
 - Sanded and painted 12 fire hydrants
 - Repaired 3 fire hydrants found during flushing program
