DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES – DECEMBER 2022

- Brush removal program (on-call service December February) removed 2 truckloads

- Degenhart Park painted interior of restrooms
- Fleet repairs from snow and ice control operations
- Founders Bend Park finalizing plans and permits for pavilion install and handicap access
- Groveport Municipal Golf Course installed roof access ladder on exterior

 - 129.7 tons of rock salt used, totaling \$8,031.02
 - 250 gallons of liquid ice melt applied, totaling \$132.50
 - 16 bags of ice melt, totaling \$280.00
 - 411.5 labor hours, totaling \$16,281.31
