

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT TO COUNCIL February 21, 2022

ACTIVITIES IN PROGRESS

- Fifty one Storz adapters have been ordered to be installed on fire hydrants in the community
- Infrastructure asset and work order management
 - Asset Essentials program was selected
 - o Configuration and implementation started in January 2022
 - o Full implementation expected to take six to eight months for completion
- Meetings
 - Director and Superintendent received a tour of the Rumpke recycling facility in efforts to increase recycling participation throughout the community
- Professional Development
 - O Director and Superintendent attended a two hour webinar on new training requirements for CDL testing for new drivers
- Snow and ice control operations
 - o January 2022
 - 5 snow events
 - 10.50 inches of snow
 - 276 tons of salt used, totaling \$12,944.82
 - 292 gallons of liquid applied to salt, totaling \$430.34
 - 292 labor hours
 - o Roads were pretreated with liquid ice melt prior to two of the snow storms
 - 2,042 gallons of liquid applied directly to pavement, totaling \$1,045.50
- Street tree maintenance
 - Maintenance activities are progressing on the top one hundred trees based on the Priority
 Tree Maintenance Listing created by Davey Resource Group
 - Arbor Barber is finishing up pruning sixty five trees
 - Twenty eighty trees were planted along roadsides in December with the remaining fifty two trees scheduled to be planted in the spring
 - Maintenance activities on the next grouping of one hundred trees are in the planning stage for early 2022
- Traffic sign replacement program
 - Staff gathering data to obtain pricing
- Vehicle and equipment replacement 2022
 - Staff completed specifications and acquired competitive pricing for replacement front end loader and snow truck
