Legislation

Solicit Proposals and Enter into a Contract for Janitorial Services (3rd Reading)

The current janitorial contract is a two-year contract with an option to renew for two additional years. We will be at the end of this four-year period in February 2018. We are requesting that proposals be solicited for a new contract for these services.

2018 Health Services Contract with Franklin County Public Health (2nd Reading)

This authorizes me to sign our annual health services contract. The 2018 contract cost is \$46,682.64 which is a 5% increase from 2017. We are charged per capita.

2018 Appropriations (1st Reading)

The Appropriations have been completed. The budget report will be provided to you at tonight's meeting for your review prior to Committee of the Whole meeting.

Support for Use of American Steel and Aluminum (1st Reading)

This is an emergency resolution that will support and protect the use of American-made steel and aluminum as supported by several Ohio representatives in Congress. We are asking for emergency because October is Ohio Manufacturing Month.

Driveway Easement for 4216 Rohr Road (1st Reading)

The driveway at 4216 Rohr Road crosses City property (the old canal land on the north side of Rohr Road). There has never been an easement to allow this although this is the only access for the property. Because they are selling this property, a formal easement is needed. As part of the easement agreement we are prohibiting any structures from being erected in the easement area as well as permitting the City full use of the easement area should it be needed in the future (such as street widening, etc.). While this is not emergency legislation, we are requesting that Council consider all three readings at tonight's meeting since the owners are trying to clean this up for the sale of the property.
