Leak Detection at Groveport Aquatic Center

American Leak Detection was at the Groveport Aquatic Center for their annual spring inspection. The group found a few leaks. Unfortunately, we had to drain approx. half of the pool to further analyze the situation.

The main leak was coming from an underground 1.5" pipe feeding a line at the In-Water Playground. The valve for this line has been closed. A small leak was also located at a failed wall return fitting at the lazy river. A few leaks from cracks were also detected in the dive well. All items will be addressed after the season. The pool is now full.

Cold Beverage Provider
