



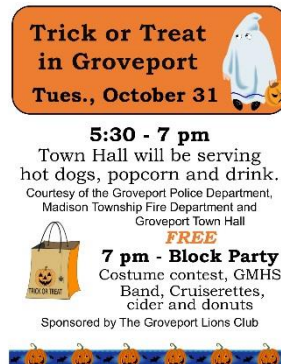

Children's Programs

The new Home School Science program is exceeding our expectations. There has been so much interest we had to add some additional times for this program so we could accommodate those on a waiting list. For the month of October they are discussing the human body and how it works. The first organ they learned about was lungs. Activities Assistant Angela Martin created some very simple gadgets for the children to use to show how lungs work. They also did some activities that showed the harder you play

or work the less air you have in your lungs. The most exciting part of this class, Miss Angela was able to obtain a real cow lung. Before Ms. Angela show everyone the lung she wanted to explain to the class what they were going to do with the lung. She told the class if a child did not want to participate that was fine. All the children were so thrilled about seeing a real lung. They learned about blood clots, the tissue, trachea and they even used magnifying glass to see what the naked eye could not see.

The kids and parents enjoyed the class and couldn't wait to hear what the next organ that Ms. Angela was going to bring in.
