City Administrator Report to Council BJ King, City Administrator June 14, 2021

Legislative items

• Ord 2021-020 – 2nd reading: Amendment to Codified Ordinance Chapter 153, Public Service Department

Approval of Ordinance 2021-020 would amend Codified Ordinance 153 to add a section that will allow the City to seek restitution from individuals who cause damage to public property. An example of how this policy will be used is when a motorists has an accident and there is damage to guardrail, street signs, street lights, etc...In the past, the City has paid for the repairs. Approval of this ordinance will provide a process for the City to seek restitution from individuals, or their insurance company, to cover the cost of repairs.

• Ord. 2021-024 - 1st reading: Canal Street and Shoemaker Alley one-way

We received a request to make Canal Street and Shoemaker Alley one-way travel due to the narrow nature of these roads. With the roads being narrow, if motorists try to pass each other going in different directions, one or both, motorists must pull over which results in driving in a resident's yard. Attached to this report is an exhibit that shows that Shoemaker Alley would be one-way travel to the west and Canal Street would be oneway travel to the east. The circles on the map indicate properties that may be required to change their driving habits if these roadways are made one-way travel. I plan to send correspondence to each property owner to get feedback.

• Ord. 2021-025 - 1st reading: Parks Rules amendments

We receive a number of requests each year from patrons who ask if they can have a bounce house or other inflatable/entertainment at a park. Our rules do not address such items, but our standard answer is "no." Approval of this ordinance would memorialize in our Codified Ordinances, specific to Park Rules, that such items are prohibited. Additionally, this ordinance includes a request to add to the Parks Rules a prohibition against stapling/nailing signs, flyers, etc...to picnic tables, shelter house, or any park facility. Attached is a report from Kyle Lund that provides additional information about this request.

 Ord 2021-026- 1st reading: School Resource Officer Agreement 2021-2022 school year Approval of this ordinance would authorize the execution of an agreement with the Groveport Madison School District for a School Resource Officer for the 2021-2022 school year. Chief Adams met with the school superintendent and they are in favor of the agreement. This should be referred to the June 21st Committee of the Whole meeting.

• Ord. 2021-028 -1st reading: Flower Boutique installation of rod iron fence encroaching into public right-of-way

Owners of the Flower Boutique have contacted the City to inquire about the installation of a rod iron railing along the steps and concrete entryway for their business and the neighboring barbershop. As proposed the railing would encroach into the public right-ofway. In order for the railing to be approved as proposed, Council would have to approve legislation to permit the right-of-way encroachment. I believe the installation of the railing will look nice and serve the businesses well. I can't identify any significant detriments to authorizing the installation of the fence, which will encroach into the public right-of-way.
