***Legislation***

Repeal Ordinance 17-016 (2<sup>nd</sup> Reading)

The Building Department has been informed that the applicant who requested a use variance for a dental assistant training facility at 5055 Hamilton Road is no longer moving forward with the project. The new proposed legislation will repeal the original use variance ordinance.

Authorize the Construction of Two (2) Tennis Courts at Degenhart Park (1<sup>st</sup> Reading)

Council has discussed the possibility of adding two (2) additional tennis courts at Degenhart Park. Approval/dis-approval of this ordinance would provide staff with the necessary direction to take on this project.

Ohio-Erie Canal Locks Project

There is an effort underway to nominate the canal locks from Portsmouth to Baltimore to the National Register as a historic district. The district will include all of the canal locks and related features with each grouping having its own defined boundaries. The nomination will discuss the overall historic and engineering significance of the canal system and include additional significance associated with the separate portions as they relate to the history and development of their specific locations. An introductory meeting was held on January 4<sup>th</sup>, which Tom Byrne attended on behalf of the City. We will be continuing to work on this effort.
