In the process I lost my December school incident list and was unable to provide the monthly stats for council. I will say from memory we had very few incidents and all around the beginning of the school year has been a great improvement from the last two years. One good thing to come from the days with no computer access is the students were unable to get on social media or look up subjects not related to classwork. The Groveport-Madison schools even adopted a new rule of the administrators only have access to the schools Wi-Fi password.

NON-HIGH SCHOOL ACTIVITY OF NOTE:

12/9 Patrol officer took report from mother of Groveport Imagine Middle School who stated her child had been assaulted on the school bus by three other students. Charges were filed against the three students.

12/15 Patrol officer was sent to Groveport Elementary on report of inappropriate physical contact between students. Officer spoke with a 4th grade female student and her mother and school principal – the student stated that another female student had been pushing her and grabbing at her breast multiple times throughout the past few weeks. Student stated that the suspect girl was otherwise her friend and hadn't acted like that in the past. All parties agreed to allow school principal to handle the issue.

12/23 Patrol officers responded to Groveport Elementary on report of inappropriate photos on a student's cellphone. Student brought pictures to school principal who contacted police. Investigating officers observed a few pictures of an unidentified black male juvenile with his genitals exposed. Other students stated that they thought the picture was of a person named Braxton which is not a registered name in the school district. Other info arose indicating that the student might reside in Lancaster. Officers contacted Lancaster PD who investigated but could find no student by that name in their district. Due to the nature of the cellphone picture delivery, the originating source phone could not be found.

Monthly Notable Activity/Notes- Chief Casey M. Adams

The month of December was an eventful time for the Groveport Police Department. Newly hired Ptl. Josh Dillard began his second month of Field Training and is progressing at a steady pace. His fellow officers continue to approach me and compliment how well Ptl Dillard is fitting into the police department, and they feel his enthusiasm and pro-active patrolling will be a great benefit to the Groveport Police Department & City of Groveport.

As mentioned during the December City Council Meeting, Ptl. Kevin Chavez and Sgt. John Westhoven attempted to stop a stolen vehicle on Main Street, and again on Delane Road. The juveniles operating the vehicle fled from our officers, struck multiple pedestrian vehicles, and were eventually apprehended in a backyard on Elm Street. No injuries occurred, and there was a lot of teamwork between our agency, Madison Township Police Department and Obetz Police Department in order to bring this criminal situation to a safe ending.

As always, the men and women of the Groveport Police Department participated in the Heritage Holiday. Santa made several appearances within the City of Groveport, and Santa & his elves sent the kids from Groveport Elementary off with the Christmas Spirit on the last day of school for winter break.

I would like to thank Brian Strayer and his staff for mounting the final two Mobile Pro Systems Intersection Cameras on the traffic light poles on Hamilton Road at Groveport Road, and Hamilton Road at Old Hamilton Road. These units will not only assist the police department in criminal investigations, but also assist Brian Strayers Department on monitoring the streets during the winter season.

Probationary Officers James Reed, Freeman Nixon, and Gregrey Martin have all reached their one-year anniversary with our department. They have all successfully completed their field training and have spent time on all three shifts working with all officers and supervisors. We have gotten good reports and feedback from the supervisors and the officers who enjoy working with the three and feel they are safe and efficient officers. All have also worked as minimum staffing without supervision and are able to function and perform without issue.

It is my recommendation that all three be released from probationary status and be designated as full-time patrol officers.

Total Cases Assigned to the Bureau in December, 2023: 15


Flock Cameras

Flock License Plate Reads: Total plates read in December were 665,000
Flock License Plate Alerts: Total plate alerts in December were 100

The City of Groveport owns 10-Flock cameras currently, but as a part of Flock we currently have access to 4,112 cameras nationwide.

Clearview Facial Recognition

<u>Clearview Facial Recognition Scans</u> – 34 searches in December, 2023 with 76% identifying rate.



<u>New Hire Background Checks:</u> In the month of December, 2023 the Detective Bureau was assigned background investigations for 5-new hire applicants. These are very time consuming and thorough investigations.

The Groveport Detective Bureau processes countless search warrants and subpoenas each month to complete our cases. With these court orders being needed for nearly every investigation, it would be very difficult to keep an exact number processed each month.



Notable Cases:

- On 12/2/2023, a male reached over the counter at Certified Gas Station grabbing a hand-full of lottery tickets. The male fled the scene. Detective Amabile used both intersection and flock cameras to identify the vehicle used during the theft. Further investigation into the vehicle, identified the suspect (45-yr Columbus male) who was criminal charged. The same suspect stole a large amount of lottery tickets in Fairfield County as well, so we provided them our investigation to be able to charge the male in theirs also.
- On 12/4/2023 in the overnight hours a U-Haul trailer was stolen from a business on Hendron Rd. Detective Amabile used flock cameras to identify the vehicle used in the theft. Further investigation led to Detectives locating the suspect vehicle in Reynoldsburg. Detectives identified the suspect and through an interview, he drove Detectives to the location of the stolen trailer. The trailer was returned to the business and the male (51-yr Columbus male) has been referred for indictment.
- 12/7/2023, Flock cameras alerted patrol to a stolen Hyundai entering the city. Upon attempting to stop the vehicle, it fled from officers striking two occupied vehicles. The Detective bureau and patrol worked together to take three-juveniles into custody and recover the stolen vehicle. Two of the juveniles were reported missing and one female juvenile had 5-active warrants. Charges were filed on two of the three juveniles. All three were taken to Franklin County Juvenile Detention Center.
- On 12/11/2023, Officer Martin initiated a traffic stop on a vehicle. During the stop, number checks in other people's names were discovered in the vehicle. Detective Fairman confirmed the checks to be stolen and the adult male Groveport resident will be charged with receiving stolen property.
- During the month of December, Detectives received and began investigating a tip into trafficking in drugs. On 12/24/2023, the detective bureau concluded the investigation, partnering with patrol. A search warrant was executed at 450 Main St, where cocaine, digital scales/packaging material and a handgun was recovered as evidence. The Groveport resident was arrested and slated into the Franklin County Jail for possession of cocaine and trafficking in cocaine. The investigation did conclude that the suspect was actively selling cocaine in the City of Groveport.
- Sergeant Gilbert continues to assist the United States Marshals in locating violent fugitives as a task-force officer with the Marshals and it's our hope to expand this to Detective Fairman also in 2024.

The Detective Bureau has been selected to attend training in Birmingham, Alabama in 2024 through the U.S. Secret Service. Detective Amabile and Fairman will attend a one-week long course on cryptocurrency investigations and Cyber Investigations. This is at no cost to the City of Groveport and funded by the Secret Service.
