Previous discussions indicate that they do not feel it is worth the \$150,000. They don't have that many employees using the service. Obetz plans to install some sidewalks and use Uber to transport people. Mr. Cleary stated since they are dropping out of the program, Groveport needs to rebrand its buses and remove all references to Obetz.
