- Legislation

Donation of Property to Heritage Society (2nd reading) – This legislation authorizes the donation of the two properties on Wirt Road to the Groveport Heritage and Preservation Society for the relocation of the historic structure from the property located at Rohr and Pontius.

Right-of-way Easement (2nd reading) - This legislation will allow for an access easement from Wirt Road through our canal land properties to the above parcels.

Lease Agreement with Greater Groveport Food Pantry for 595 Cherry Street Building (1st reading) – a draft lease agreement has been prepared with several of the discussion items from Council’s June 15 COTW meeting included.

Lease Agreement and Authorize Bids for up to Four (4) 2016 Starcraft MVP 28-Passenger Shuttle Buses for Transportation Department (1st reading) – As we discussed in the past, as deadlines approach we will need emergency legislation at times. We need a lead time of at least 8 weeks from order to delivery for the vehicles, and need 2 weeks for advertising for bids. Prior to the actual purchase we will bring an ordinance to Council for change of Appropriations.

- 4th of July Parade

You can either meet at the parade line-up by Sedalia at 10:30am or be at the municipal building parking lot at 10:00am and we can take you to the parade line-up; whichever is easier. We will make sure you return after the parade, as always.

- Records Destruction

Municipal office staff will be having two records destruction workdays on June 25 and June 26 as part of the staff’s intent to destroy any records already approved for destruction and classify all records destruction schedules prior to the next Records Commission meeting in August.

Dane Hudson, Maintenance Worker II in Public Works, passed his OEPA Class I certification, and has taken the Utility Worker I position that has remained unfilled due to lack of qualified applicants. This is the same pay grade, and based on our Compensation Plan was moved one step up in that grade.
