DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES – SEPTEMBER 2022

- Apple Butter Day event preparations with Community Affairs Department
- Brush removal program removed 20 truckloads of brush and disposed at recycling facility
- Budget preparations Director and Superintendents
- Cemetery operations leveled 3 leaning headstones
- Facility maintenance building gutter repairs and continued repairs on salt barn at Public Works
- Fleet preparations for winter operations
- Installed anti-slip material to walk bridge boards at Groveport Park
