# January Events & Activities at the Senior Center

## A few closures...

January brings two holidays, New Year and Martin Luther King Jr. Day. For these January holidays, we do not have programming at the Groveport Senior Center. If the Recreation Center is open, members can use the space but normal programming is cancelled for City recognized holidays.
