



FACILITIES, PARKS & PUBLIC WORKS REPORT TO COUNCIL

DEPARTMENT ACTIVITIES – OCTOBER 2022

- Brush removal program – removed 17 truckloads of brush and disposed at recycling facility
- Fleet preparations for winter operations
- Founders Bend – cleared vegetation and debris around pond, in response to resident concern
- Golf Course – replaced glass block window from burglary damage
- Heritage Park – replaced entire split rail fence and reinstalled electric outlet boxes
- Interviews for Grounds Maintenance Worker and Public Works Maintenance Worker
- Leaf collection – removed 250 cubic yards of leaves and disposed at recycling facility
- Meetings Public Service Director
 - Apple Butter Day event planning
 - Central Ohio APWA (American Public Works Association) board meeting
 - Vector Security to discuss concerns with their current service
 - Veteran's Day event preparations with Community Affairs Department
 - Virtual demonstration for cemetery asset management software

- Water treatment and distribution maintenance
