We are seeing a slight uptick in ridership in the first quarter of 2021 (compared to the 4th quarter of 2020). We have prioritized and been able to take several of our clients to get their Covid-19 vaccinations. We are pleased with the first quarter numbers and we see no barriers toward our goal of 85 unique riders for 2021.

We are also pleased to report that all of our drivers and staff have had, at least, their first dose of Covid-19 vaccination.
