- Legislation

Heritage Society Use Variance (Public hearing and 3<sup>rd</sup> Reading) – The society turned in an application for a Use Variance for the relocation of the historic structure to the property we are donating to them. The application is actually in the City’s name because we still have ownership. I have provided them with a letter authorizing the society to act as the City’s agent for this request.

Amending Water Rules and Regulations (3<sup>rd</sup> Reading) – We had an issue occur recently that we want to address in our water rules. Unbeknownst to us, the senior facility on Green Ave did routine flushing of their fire lines which stirred up sediment in our water main. This resulted in orange water in the local main and numerous customer complaints. Once we became aware we went over immediately and flushed the hydrants. We want to add a requirement to our rules that the City must be notified prior to flushing of a fire service line in order to have time to notify the area residents.

Donation of Property to Heritage Society (1<sup>st</sup> Reading) – This legislation authorizes the donation of the two properties on Wirt Road to the Groveport Heritage and Preservation Society for the relocation of the historic structure from the property located at Rohr and Pontius.

Right-of-way Easement (1<sup>st</sup> Reading) – This legislation will allow for an access easement from Wirt Road through our canal land properties to the above parcels.
