Re-zoning of 2690 London Groveport Road (3rd Reading)

Re-zoning from Rural (Un-zoned) to Community Service (CS). Recommendation from Planning & Zoning Commission

School Resource Officer Agreement (1st Reading)

It is once again time for a new two school-year agreement for a school resource officer. We are requesting that Council waive the three readings and adopt as emergency legislation so that the agreement is signed and in place prior to the beginning of the school year.

Fence Easement (1st Reading)

After several months working with the property owner we have come to resolution for the City to erect fence segments to augment the mound and landscaping on the property located at 6390 Commerce Court. This will provide additional buffer between the new warehouse and the residents along a section of Shaffer Drive. They want to approve this through a fence easement and agreement. The cost for this is borne by the tree replacement fees paid by the Northpointe development. We are requesting that Council waive the three readings and adopt as emergency legislation so that we can sign the easement agreement document and get this project underway.
