FAQs regarding Property Maintenance

By: Groveport Building & Zoning Department

Q: What is the max. allowed height for grass on a property?

A: Grass & weeds are not to exceed 10 inches.

Q: Are there regulations pertaining to swimming pools & pool enclosures?

A: Yes, pools hot tubs & spas (containing water more than 24 in. in depth & having more than 150 square feet surface area require Zoning Dept. approval. Additional requirements may exist that should be specifically addressed with the Building & Zoning Dept. prior to installation.

Q: Can "junk" vehicles be parked or stored on a property?

A: No. Inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicles are prohibited.

Q: Can vehicles be parked in the grass on a property?

A: No. Parking in grass is prohibited.

Q: Can I park/store my recreational equipment on my property?

A: Motorized recreational equipment & trailers (such as campers, travel trailers, motor homes) may be either parked on a paved surface in the side or rear yards or on the paved driveway or properly maintained existing gravel driveway surface.

Q: Are building addresses required?

A: Yes, buildings must have address numbers plainly legible & visible from the street fronting the property. Address number shall contrast with their background, be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters, and be a minimum of 4 inches (102 mm) high with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch (12.7 mm). House or building numbers are not only convenient when looking for an address, they are also required by City Ordinances, and necessary for emergency responders. When responding to an emergency, minutes matter so be sure that emergency personnel can easily and quickly find your address.

Q: Who should I contact with questions or Property Maintenance concerns?

First-Year Team Makes a Big Splash

Groveport-Madison High School offered Varsity Swimming for the first time in school history. Groveport City Council permitted the team to hold their practices at the Groveport Recreation Center's Indoor Pool.

The team only had 2 swimmers who had ever competed in a swim meet. At the beginning of the season, many of the student-athletes were not able to swim a lap and were only able to swim freestyle. With much practice and dedication, swimmers learned how to dive off of the starting blocks and began to hold their own in a swim meet.

The first few swim meets gave the Cruisers a chance to gain confidence and much need competition experience. By the end of the season, the team was achieving 2nd and 3rd place honors in meets with four to seven teams. As a team, the swimmers dropped large amounts of time, learned to compete in every event and even sent athletes to compete in District competition. The girls' team came close to sending a swimmer to Districts and our boys' team sent a swimmer to compete in both the 50 freestyle and 100 breaststroke. The team also sent a team to compete in the 200 yard free relay. The boys' team improved their times as individuals and as a relay team.

According to Coach Webber, "The team is very appreciative of the Recreation Center, its staff and the patrons who also use the pool for all of their support over the season. This has been an incredible first year journey and we look forward to many more seasons. Go Cruisers!"

Sports Medicine Minute Frequently Asked Questions

Why should I use ice and not heat on my injury?

Ice is the best way to prevent additional swelling to a new injury. Heat applied to a new injury will only increase swelling to the area and increase recovery time. Ice should be applied directly to the area for twenty minutes and off for sixty minutes. Do not sleep with an ice bag on an injury.

If an athlete does not bring their inhaler to practice and is prone to asthma attacks, should the athlete be able to practice?

If an athlete knows that he/she is prone to attacks the inhaler should be treated as part of their equipment. Inhalers are prescription only and athletic trainers or coaches do not have them available in first aide kits.

What is the best way to stay hydrated?

The best way to stay fully hydrated for your sport is to consume plenty of water. If your sport or activity last longer than one hour a sports drink is recommended for consumption after the event. Use caution if you are consuming sports drinks during competition, the sugar content could cause nausea in some athletes.

Can my son or daughter play with a cast or brace?

Cast and brace regulations are dependent upon the sport in which your son or daughter participates in. Example: An athlete can participate in football with a padded cast and release note from the physician. An athlete can participate in basketball with an ACL brace if it is plastic or covered by a soft sleeve. Basketball players cannot have anything device that is hard from the shoulder to the fingertips.

When does my athlete need to see a physician? When does my athlete need an x-ray?

If any injury does not respond to basic first aide measures or symptoms worsen of a 24-48 hour period it is recommended that your athlete seek a physicians care. X-rays are recommended for athletes who have boney tenderness, decreased range of motion and/or excessive swelling in an area.

When can my son or daughter return to play?

If your son or daughter is under the care of a physician the timetable for their return is set by the physician. Athlete's should be able to return to play safely given the injury has had time to heal so the athlete is not put at further risk for re-injury.

BAKED REUBEN CASSEROLE

5 to 6 slices of rye bread, divided 3/4 pound thinly sliced corned beef or pastrami (shaved)

1 cup rinsed and well-drained sauerkraut 3/4 cup dill pickles, chopped

1 teaspoon caraway seeds

4 cups Swiss cheese, shredded

3 eggs

1 cup milk

1/4 cup prepared yellow mustard1/4 cup Thousand Island salad dressing

Butter a deep (11x7x3-inch) baking dish. Preheat the oven to 350. Cut 3 to 4 pieces of the bread into cubes so that you have 2 cups of bread cubes. Line the bottom of the dish with the bread cubes. Cover with half of the corned beef. Make additional layers in this order: sauerkraut, pickles, caraway seeds, 2 cups of cheese, the remaining beef, and the remaining cheese. With a whisk, beat together the eggs, milk, mustard and Thousand Island dressing until well mixed. Pour over the casserole. Using a blender or food processor, make 1 cup of fresh bread crumbs with the remaining slices of bread. Sprinkle the bread crumbs over the top of the casserole. Bake at 350 for 40 minutes or until set in the center.
