Administrator Marsha Hall stated the City's Compensation Plan is on a three calendar year basis. The first year the City does a salary survey which was done last year. The other two years of that three year term the City determines, from a number of sources, whether or not there should be a cost-of-living adjustment. Social Security has indicated that the cost-of-living adjustment is 2% for 2018. Staff is requesting Council's consideration for passing this Ordinance as emergency legislation so the pay scale is in place for the hiring of the City's seasonal employees. Seasonal employees are the ones that will be most affected by the 2% pay scale increase.
