Mayor Lance Westcamp and Groveport City Council,

I have looked into the possibility of the Groveport Police Department having Training Credits in our Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy Account due to the guest lectures and instructional time provided by Chief Ralph Portier and Sgt. Brian Thompson. Lt. Bary Murphy contacted the Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy on Tuesday, May 11<sup>th</sup>, 2021, he was advised that all training credits had been applied to previous training classes that were attended by Groveport Police Department Personnel, and there was a zero balance in our account at this time.

I am also looking into opportunities for the Groveport Police Department to host regionalized training courses here in the City of Groveport, this would give our officers a more convenient way to attend educational opportunities by staying close to the City of Groveport, but also allow officers to attend training while on duty and reduce the amount of time away from the city. The Ohio Peace Officer Training Academy before Covid-19 was looking at ways to taking their training course out of London, Ohio and bringing them to locations where multiple law enforcement agencies could attend training locally and share in the cost of the training course(s). I would like to research possible city locations that could accommodate training sessions that typically seat between 25 to 40 individuals at a training session, and to also see what type of training local police organizations are looking to send their personnel to in the near future.

For the time being, I am looking for our officers to attend mandatory First Aid and CPR Training, Community Based Outreach Program Training, Legal Updates on court rulings, and Use of Force Legal Issues. Finally, I have been fortunate to attend several Supervisory/Leadership Courses over the past decade, and I am looking to provide the same opportunities to our current and future leadership team in order to give them the tools to evolve from being a patrol officer to a leader within the police department.
