

City of Groveport Transportation

Progress Report

We are pleased with our ridership for the second quarter of 2021. Our clients took 120 more rides with Groveport Senior Transportation to medical and personal appointments in the second quarter than in the first quarter. We're seeing our clients catching up on their medical appointments that were postponed in 2020 as well as people getting out to do shopping and other personal appointments. We do not see any barriers toward our goal of 85 unique riders at this time.

We are pleased to report that all of our drivers and staff are fully vaccinated for Covid-19.

Senior Center Council Report June 2021

The Groveport Senior Center added activities in June as we continue to ramp up our programs post Covid-19. We are seeing more members each week taking part in more activities.

Activities

- Craft club sponsored by Wesley Ridge Retirement Community met in person for the first time since February 2020.
- Senior Chair Volleyball continues to be very popular with an average of 13 players at each game.
- We have two different card games that members are attending, Euchre and Hand & Foot. Card games continue to be a very popular activity at the Groveport Senior Center.
- Billiards play twice a week.
- We are offering an instructor led art/craft activity on Thursdays. This activity has not been well attended so we will be considering moving Art/Craft time to a different day/time.
- Book club meets on July 13th.
- We introduced our Lock 22 Café idea in June. We did not have participation for the first 4 weeks. We created a “punch” card incentive program for the coffee and donuts social hour. After creating the cards we had 5 people come to enjoy coffee, donuts and conversation on July 30th. We’re looking forward to growing this activity.
- Our first month of BYO lunch on Thursdays was quite successful. Members are enjoying spending time and having lunch together. We’re averaging 20 members for lunchtime social hour. Many stay after lunch to play cards.
- We’ve added a Music & Movement program on Tuesday mornings. Music & Movement combines line dancing and other dance instruction during the Tuesday time slot. We’ve had an average of 10 dancers for this new program.

Armchair Travel

The Ashford on Broad Senior Living is sponsoring a monthly program event called Armchair Travel. The participants see a movie on a selected country and the Chef from Ashford prepares traditional food from that country. The first program was India. July’s country is Thailand. Russia and Poland will round out the program and each of the participants that have had their “passport” stamped will receive a gift from Ashford on Broad.

Trips

The first trip that we partner with Pickerington Senior Center & Canal Winchester Senior Center is in the books. The trip to Nashville, Tennessee was enjoyed by all who traveled. Upcoming trips:

The trip includes antique shop, arts & crafts shop, deli and ice cream shop. The trip is already full and will take place on the 20th of July. (masks will still be required while riding on the bus)
